

## Trackback Submitter User Manual

Trackback Submitter will submit comments to all websites (which support trackback protocol) with links to your website. To use Universal Trackback Submitter, your server must have Apache + PHP with Zend Optimizer and cURL installed. If Zend Optimizer or cURL are not installed, ask your hosting provider to do so. Also be careful when choosing your hosting provider – many hosting companies may suspend your accounts if they will receive complaints from blog owners that you submit trackbacks too often. I suggest to get reseller hosting package (so you may host unlimited domains) from DimeReseller ( <http://www.dimereseller.com/> ), because this company has 100% Trackback Submitter compatible and highly optimized servers (so you will get the best results possible) and does not care about blog spamming or trackback advertising.

Use cPanel (or any other way) to setup new MySQL database. Don't forget to create MySQL username, add it to your database and grant all privileges.

Upload everything in **BINARY MODE** to your domain and chmod "*blacklist.txt*", "*config.inc.php*", "*comments\_trackback.txt*" and "*license.dat*" files to 777. Open [http://yourdomain.com/trackback\\_install/](http://yourdomain.com/trackback_install/) and follow installation wizard to complete installation.

Open cPanel and use Cronjobs feature to setup new cronjobs. You will need to setup 2 new cronjobs. Enter these commands into command fields:

```
php -q /FULL_PATH_TO_UPLOADED_FILES/ trackback_direct_1.php  
php -q /FULL_PATH_TO_UPLOADED_FILES/ trackback_direct_2.php
```

Usually *FULL\_PATH\_TO\_UPLOADED\_FILES* is something like */home/account\_username/public\_html/* (ask your hosting provider if not very sure). Please note that cronjobs can **NOT** be running at the same time. If you want to run script 6 times per day for example, you should setup cron at these hours:

```
trackback_direct_1.php - 1, 5, 9, 13, 17, 21  
trackback_direct_2.php - 2, 6, 10, 14, 18, 22
```

**THIS IS EXAMPLE ONLY!!! NEVER NEVER NEVER SETUP EXACTLY THE SAME CRONJOBS INTERVAL FOR ALL OF YOUR DOMAINS. USE DIFFERENT CRONJOBS INTERVALS ON DIFFERENT DOMAINS.**

## Software Management

To manage your domains, keywords, blacklist, proxy settings and much more, use Trackback Submitter Admin Panel located at [http://yourdomain.com/trackback\\_admin/](http://yourdomain.com/trackback_admin/) which contains sections needed to modify software configuration, check reports of submitted trackbacks and more...

## License Validation

Trackback Submitter has active license validation system, which connects to our servers every X days and validates your license. If license is invalid or deactivated (when customer requests for refund, for example), software simply stops working and displays error message.

Trackback Submitter also comes with protection against fraudulent orders. When customer installs software, installation wizard connects to our servers and customer details (server's IP where software is being installed, IP address used to make order, email address used to make order, etc.) are logged on our database. In case order is fraudulent, we deactivate license and forward these details to Internet Crime Complaint Center, National White Collar Crime Center **AND** hosting (or server) provider.

## FREE BONUS!

I'm giving you free bonus to make your work easier. As you know, many blogs use trackback spam protection (one of most popular tools – "Spam Karma") to prevent spammers like you. I know how to trick it! If your pages are powered by PHP, just add this code to your page which is used to get visitors (if you are spamming blogs using link <http://yourdomain.com> for example, add this code to your index.php file):

```
<?php include_once ('antispam.php'); ?>
```

It works only when Universal Trackback Submitter is installed on your site.

## Valuable Tips

Be sure to “split” cronjobs if running multiple websites. Let’s say you have 2 websites and setup cronjob to be launched 01.00 AM on 1<sup>st</sup> website. Be sure to use different time (like 01.10 AM) on 2<sup>nd</sup> website. It will produce you better results.

Don’t “overdose” by submitting thousands of trackbacks per day. Be smart when using this script. Yes, it’s really powerful – so powerful that you can get your websites banned by search engines if you will run this script every several minutes (it will submit the way toooooo much trackbacks). I tested it on 10+ sites and may tell you that running Trackback Submitter from 3 to 8 times per day is really enough. Leave it running for months (while all your keywords will be used for spam) and you will have tons of backlinks soon.

Choose your keywords. If you are going to submit trackbacks after entering keyword “Marketing” for example, you will be very lucky if you will get 1 backlink after submitting 100 trackbacks. If your keyword will be something like “Cheap and Effective Internet Marketing Services”, you should get about 10 backlinks easily after submitting 100 trackbacks.

Remember – most blogs have comments (and trackbacks) disabled or under moderation (would you like to get your blog spammed with hundreds of comments per day?), so average success rate is about 2-10% (it means you get from 2 to 10 backlinks after submitting 100 trackbacks usually). Believe me, it’s more than enough (you will be using lots of keywords, right?).

Be creative and patient. Don’t post comments like “Nice site, please visit mycrap.com”. Post something natural-looking to get your comment approved. If reports display that site was spammed and you don’t see your link there right now, don’t worry – it’s possible your comment is awaiting moderation. The best results will come within 2-3 months after starting to use Trackback Submitter.

## Problems and Solutions

**Problem:** You get “unable to read X bytes” error message when trying to run this script.

**Solution:** Delete all uploaded files, configure your FTP client to upload files in **BINARY** mode and re-upload all files again.

**Problem:** Cronjob does not work properly.

**Solution:** Replace “`php -q /FULL_PATH_TO_UPLOADED_FILES/file.php`” to “`wget -O /dev/null http://domain\_where\_script\_installed.com/path/to/file.php`”.

### Additional Notes

What else... I'm making even more powerful tools right now (scripts to look for text links partners, email them and approve/decline their backlinks automatically, scripts to spam other types of websites, etc.) and you may always contact me for these.
